A MINDSET WITH PROBLEM SOLVING

Learning to solve problems is a valuable skill. Consider sharing these tips with your child:

- Talk it out. Describing a problem to someone you trust can help you understand the problem more clearly.
- > Stay focused. Don't let emotions or distractions get in the way of solving the problem.
- Use your experiences. Ask yourself if you ever had to solve a similar problem. Did your solution work? Why or why not? Adjust as needed.
- ➢ Be flexible. If new information comes up while you problem solve, be willing to change your approach.
- Team up. Work with others if you can. Listen to and evaluate their ideas for a solution.

It is important to teach our children we must be willing to make mistakes. When you try a solution and it doesn't work out, you grow by gaining understanding that will help you in the future!
