#### **WHAT IS A LUTHERAN?**

When Martin Luther posted his 95 theses on the door of the Castle Church at Wittenberg on Oct. 31, 1517, he had no intention of starting a new church, much less one named after him. His goal was to correct the abuses that he found in the church of his day, such as indulgences and the adoration of relics. When the pope drove Luther out of the church, however, Luther's followers began to call themselves "Lutherans," though Luther himself never was in favor of this.

Today Lutherans are those who accept the reforms of Martin Luther as spelled out in his Small Catechism and the other Lutheran confessional writings such as the Augsburg Confession. Lutherans especially stress that we are saved by God's grace alone, through faith in Jesus Christ, and not by our own works. Lutheranism is one of the largest branches of Protestantism with over 81 million people claiming to be Lutheran. In the United States, the main Lutheran denominations are the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), our own Missouri Synod (LCMS), and the Wisconsin Synod (WELS).
