THIS WE BELIEVE... WHAT IS A HYMN?

Hymns are sacred poetry set to music and sung in the course of public worship. Hymns have always been a part of the worship of God's people. The earliest hymns are the psalms that are recorded for us in Holy Scripture. According to Mark 14:26, Jesus and His disciples "sang a hymn" before leaving the Upper Room on Maundy Thursday. (It was most likely Psalms 113 – 118, commonly sung at the end of the Passover meal.) Among the earliest Christian hymns are the canticles which are now part of our worship services – The *Gloria in Excelsis*, the *Magnificat*, and the *Nunc Dimittis*.

The Lutheran Reformation ushered in the golden age of Lutheran hymnody. Martin Luther himself is the author of many hymns, such as *A Mighty Fortress Is Our God*. Modern hymn writing and hymn singing was mainly the creation of the 18th century when hymn writers like Isaac Watts produced many of the hymns that are still in use today (*When I Survey the Wondrous Cross; O God, Our Help in Ages Past*).
